

Camping Rules/Guidelines

- 1. No excessive travel at night or shining of wildlife at night.**
- 2. No Alcoholic Beverages allowed in the park at any time.**
- 3. No campfires allowed outside of the designated camping areas, and only within fire rings provided.**
- 4. No nailing of anything to trees. No cutting of trees. No horses tied to trees. Any strings or ropes tied to trees must be removed when departing. All tent stakes must be removed when departing.**
- 5. It is the camping party's responsibility to know the opening and closing hours of the park. McIntosh Reserve is a gated facility.**
- 6. No lewd or rude conduct, loud music, or rowdy behavior. Quiet time starts at 10 pm and ends at 7 am unless otherwise specified. All noise (generators, loud talking, dogs barking, etc.) must cease at this time. Medical allowances may be made for generator usage, consult staff for details.**
- 7. Anyone may be asked to leave at any time by park staff.**
- 8. Camping fees range from \$10 per site for county residents to \$15 per site for non-residents. Camping w/horses is allowed, however horses cannot be tied directly to trees.**
- 9. Refunds are available in the event of an emergency or otherwise appropriate reason. Campers may be asked to vacate the park for emergency purposes such as severe weather or flooding.**
- 10. People camping with pets must keep their pets under control at all times. No free running animals. Leashes required for dogs. No excessive barking, etc. in campsites. No pets at Spray & Splash.**
- 11. People camping with horses are subject to these rules as well as those that normally apply to that category. All non-residents are subject to daily trail fees if camping w/horses.**
- 12. Showers must be utilized at night between the hours of 8 pm and 8 am. Shelters are rented during the day and the showers cannot be utilized during daylight hours after 8 am.**
- 13. No unauthorized people may be let in and out of the gate after closing hours (sundown). Anyone not camping should vacate the park at that time unless prior arrangements have been made with park staff. In the event of an emergency, anyone may ask to leave or utilize any issued keys to vacate the park if the gate is locked.**
- 14. No digging of any kind in the park. This includes fire pits.**
- 15. No treasure hunting or prospecting.**
- 16. No tables and/or benches may be moved for any purpose either from other campsites or pavilions.**
- 17. No tents may be set up near river trail that may impede progress through such trail. No tents may be set up on the riverbank and no vehicles may travel or park on the river trail.**
